

## Rare & Limited

### Champagne

- 1. Krug Grande Cuvée 169ème Édition champagne (Champagne, 12.5%)** **\$580**
  - 43% Pinot Noir, 35% Chardonnay and 22% Meunier (Vivino Rating : 4.6)
  - A light golden colour and fine, vivacious bubbles, holding a promise of pleasure. Aromas of flowers in bloom, ripe, dried and citrus fruits, as well as marzipan and gingerbread. Flavours of hazelnut, nougat, barley sugar, jellied and citrus fruits, almonds, brioche and honey
- 2. Le Mesnil Blanc de Blancs Grand Cru 2014 (Champagne, 12.5%)** **\$228**
  - 100% Chardonnay (Vivino Rating : 4.2)
  - Fine effervescence with a golden yellow color. Fruity and floral aromas accompanied by notes of bread & yeast. The wine is persistent on the palate with well-balanced acidity and a long finish. The nose presents loads of fresh fruit with palpable minerality and touches of brioche. The palate has a **nice attack**, with a pronounced citrus presence, as well as a **creamy texture** and **marked minerality**, typical of the **Le Mesnil terroir**. The persistent finish is marked by **beautiful tension**, which is further enhanced by its minimal dosage (6.5 g/L).

### White Wine

- 3. El Enemigo Chardonnay 2020 (Mendoza, 13.5%)** **\$138**
  - Chardonnay 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.1)
  - Light golden center with silver streaks throughout the glass. Ripe nectarine, Fuji apple, lemon meringue, and wet-stone aromas intermingle. Jasmine and lilac, along with wet minerals and salted citrus peel, make their way to the palate. The mouthfeel is glorious and polished, showing beautiful poise and elegance. The small amount of Chardonnay that rested under flor adds depth, but the wine also displays plenty of energy and buoyancy. Truly unique
- 4. Sandhi Chardonnay 2022 (Central Coast, California 13%)** **\$138**
  - Chardonnay 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.0)
  - The 2022 Chardonnay Central Coast has pure scents of yellow peach, panna cotta, bread dough, pie crust and spicy undertones. The medium-bodied palate offers dynamic flavors that range from stone fruit to honey and matchstick. It has a luxuriously silky texture, bright acidity and a long finish.

- 5. Domaine Jean-Paul Balland – Sancerre Grand Cuvée Blanc 2022 (Upper Loire Valley, 14.5%)** **\$138**
- *Sauvignon Blanc 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.3 )*
  - *Elegant, structured, and complex. It represents limpid and brilliant yellow with gold highlights. Intense and complex on the nose. Initial aromas of ripe fruits (peach, mango) evolve with aeration to show notes of acacia, pastry, hazelnut, and subtle vanilla from oak ageing. The wine is full, fleshy, and generous. It features ripe flavors of Mirabelle plum, pink grapefruit, and peach, balanced by a firm mineral, flinty structure. The Finishing is long, savory, and mineral-driven, with lingering hints of spice, verbena, and citrus peel.*
- 6. Tramin Nussbaumer Gewurztraminer 2020 (Alto Adige, 15%)** **\$150**
- *Gewürztraminer 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.3 )*
  - *Wonderful nose of yellow roses, fresh pineapple and jasmine, with delicately spicy overtones. Stunning ripeness and concentration, but even more importantly, almost impeccable balance for a grape variety that's a winemaker's nightmare. Very long, silky finish, where the 15% alcohol is barely perceptible.*
- 7. Domaine Jaeger Defaix Rully 1er Cru Cloux 2022 (Burgundy, 13.5%)** **\$168**
- *Chardonnay 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.1 )*
  - *Sweet spot Outstanding. Here the wood treatment is more subtle on the very pretty and more floral-suffused nose of citrus, anise and white orchard fruit scents. There is a finer texture to the punchier medium weight flavors that culminate in a bone-dry, balanced and even more persistent finale. The underlying tension is palpable and overall, this chiseled effort is very good and a wine that should amply repay mid-term keeping*
- 8. Domaine J.M. Boillot Montagny Premier Cru 2018 (Cote Chalonnaise, 13%)** **\$188**
- *Chardonnay 100% (Vivino Rating: 4.2 )*
  - *This wine has juicy yellow color with a slight greenish tint. Aroma of Invigorating, juicy lemon flavor and perfectly set off by baking in a bouquet of wine oak notes. Fine structure and good fresh acidity and minerality. On the palate there are shades of ripe pears, peaches, apples and light creamy nuances, rolling along with fleshy oak notes in the long aftertaste*

## Red Wine

- 8. El Enemigo Malbec 2019 (Mendoza, 13.5%)** **\$138**
- *90% Malbec, 8% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot (Vivino Rating: 4.3)*
  - *On the nose, this Malbec has floral scents of violets and lavender as well as ripe blackberries and spice from the small percentage of Petit Verdot. The wine is full-bodied with well integrated tannins and high acidity*

- 9. Crystallum Peter Max Pinot Noir 2023 (Western Cape, 14%)** **\$150**
- *100% Pinot Noir (Vivino Rating: 4.1)*
  - *This is a wonderfully elegant, full and perfumed Pinot Noir. Pale ruby colour. Loads of red fruit aromas with a hint of mushroom and earthy forest floor. The full and fruit-forward palate offers strawberry tea, ripe raspberry, sour cherry, cranberry and pomegranate flavours. Layers of mushroom, earthy forest floor, minerals and a light smokiness alongside the fruity flavours for a desirable complexity. Its like walking through a glorious forest. Young and dry, with a fresh acidity and subtle tannins*
- 10. Chacra Pinot Noir Cincuenta y Cinco 55 2017 (Patagonia, 12.8%)** **\$208**
- *100% Pinot Noir (Vivino Rating: 4.2)*
  - *Dried strawberries, blueberries and hints of subtle mint. Full-bodied, tight and structured with steely tannins and bright, flavorful fruit. Muscular and toned. It's floral, mineral and super tasty, with an almost salty finish*
- 11. Il Poggione Brunello di Montalcino 2016 (Tuscany, 14.5%)** **\$180**
- *100% Sangiovese (Vivino Rating: 4.3)*
  - *Medium dark appearance with pretty Sangiovese shine and a little ruby sparkle. This vintage shows a slightly untamed or wild side with a dense and heavier fruit profile. The focus here is on blackberry, dried cherry, tobacco and even a touch of smoky tobacco or horse saddle. The wine shows the firm grip and tannic backbone that is a common trait in this vintage, especially with the vineyards on this southern, sunlit side of the appellation.*
- 12. Villa Mongalli Sagrantino di Montefalco della cima 2011 (Umbria, 17%)** **\$180**
- *100% Sagrantino (Vivino Rating: 4.3)*
  - *Intense ruby red with garnet reflections. Spices, vanilla, herbs and ripe fruit aroma. Intense taste, well structured with dense tannins and persistent.*
- 13. Salvaterra Amarone Della Valpolicella Classico Riserva 2015 (Veneto, 16%)** **\$228**
- *65% Corvina, 10% Corvinone, 20% Rondinella, 5% other varieties of the territory.*
  - *It is a wine with personality and structure, which upon tasting is peculiar in its elegance and refinement rather than power, with a considerable complexity. In the palate it is rich and elegant, deep and balanced at the same time, still young and with good acidity but already very well-orchestrated. Spicy with the typical notes of cherry and blackcurrant that blend well with the complexity of the wine.*
- 14. Villa Fura Amarone Della Valpolicella Classico Riserva 2015 (Veneto, 15.5%)** **\$228**
- *60% Corvina, 25% Corvinone and 15% Rondinella*
  - *Intense garnet red color. On the nose it releases aromas of red fruit jam followed by notes of dried violet, rhubarb and wet earth. The olfactory picture is complemented by balsamic notes of rhubarb and notes of cinnamon, cloves and dark spices. The sip is large, enveloping and material, enhanced by an important tannic texture and a long and exciting ethereal and spicy finish.*

- 15. Conde De Los Andes Coleccion Historica 2003 (Rioja, 13%)** **\$180**
- 100% Tempranillo (Vivino Rating: 4.3)
  - Bright clear cherry with a tile rim. Complex and surrounding, with dark fruits aromas, spices, Mediterranean herbs, hints of tobacco and coffee, and other touches from the noble oak aging. Structured and rounded yet with a wonderful acidity which gives a deep sense of freshness. Soft and velvety. Long and powerful aftertaste, a true pleasure.
- 16. La Rioja Alta Gran Reserva 904 2011 (Rioja, 14.5%)** **\$228**
- 89% Tempranillo, 11% Graciano. (Vivino Rating: 4.4)
  - Lovely dried red fruit, such as plums with just a hint of prunes. Cedar, walnut and leather undertones. Full-bodied with lots of fruit, considering its age, as well as hints of smoke, tobacco, bark and black tea. Some balsamic at the finish. Traditionally styled with lovely results.
- 17. Atticus Grand Reserve Cabernet 2016 (Margaret River, 13.8%)** **\$180**
- Cabernet sauvignon, merlot, cabernet franc & petit verdot.
  - A beautifully balanced high quality Cabernet representing the best that Margaret River has to offer. Complex notes of ripe fruit entwined with the more savoury black olive, and cedar characters. The velvety palate is elegant, well structured and medium-bodied with blackcurrant, mulberry and cassis seamlessly woven with French oak and supple tannins that linger on the finish.
- 18. Reschke R.S.R Cabernet Sauvignon 2012 (Coonawarra, 14.5%)** **\$180**
- 100% Cabernet Sauvignon (Vivino Rating: 4.2)
  - The once boisterous tannins have now mellowed on the silky palate, and fruit is joined by herbaceous and somewhat meaty notes. There's still classic cabernet cassis and blackberry, which is accompanied by rosemary, thyme and a long and savoury finish.
- 19. Chateau Yaldara 1847 First Pick Shiraz 2019 (Barossa Valley, 14.9%)** **\$288**
- 100% Shiraz (Vivino Rating: 4.3)
  - This is a best of vintage pick of the fruit. There is so much going on in here. On the nose you are immediately assailed with a blackberry, black cherry and dark plum combination. But then the palate, it's intense and concentrated but there is almost an effortless big easy about it. Fine chalky tannin and a little sweet fruit, white pepper and a sprinkle of spices adds further to the sensation. It's still so tightly held and extended cellaring would pay off handsomely.
- 20. Château Moulin Saint-Georges Saint-Émilion Grand Cru 2019 (Bordeaux, 13.5%)** **\$158**
- 85% Merlot and 15% Cabernet Franc (Vivino Rating: 4.1 )
  - The 2019 Moulin St Georges has turned out brilliantly, offering up aromas of cherries, wild berries, violets, sweet spices and raw cocoa, followed by a medium to full-bodied, bright and vibrant palate, with a concentrated core of fruit, tangy acids and beautifully refined tannins. From a seven-hectare, west-facing vineyard opposite Ausone that always ripens some 10 days later than Ausone itself, Moulin St Georges has come into its own in this warm, dry vintage, delivering a wine of notable energy and finesse.

**21. Château Pedesclaux Pauillac 5<sup>th</sup> Grand Cru Classe 2019 (Bordeaux, 14%)** **\$198**

- *72% Cabernet Sauvignon, 20% Merlot, 5% Cabernet Franc, 2% Petit Verdot. (Vivino Rating: 4.1)*
- *Wonderful aromas of dried orange, blackcurrant and crushed stone follow through to a full body with beautifully polished tannins that are composed and fine. Lots of subtle and complex character on the finish.*

**22. Château Prieuré-Lichine Margaux 4<sup>th</sup> Grand Cru Classe 2019 (Bordeaux, 13.5%)** **\$198**

- *62% Cabernet Sauvignon, 35% Merlot, and 3% Petit Verdot. (Vivino Rating: 4.2)*
- *Deep garnet-purple colored, the 2019 Pedesclaux has a beguiling perfume of violets, warm cassis, preserved plums and licorice with suggestions of rose hip tea, dark chocolate, kirsch and cinnamon toast. Medium to full-bodied, the palate bursts with vibrant black and red fruits, supported by ripe, finely grained tannins and oodles of freshness, finishing long and fragrant.*
